CHILD CARE INSTITUTION

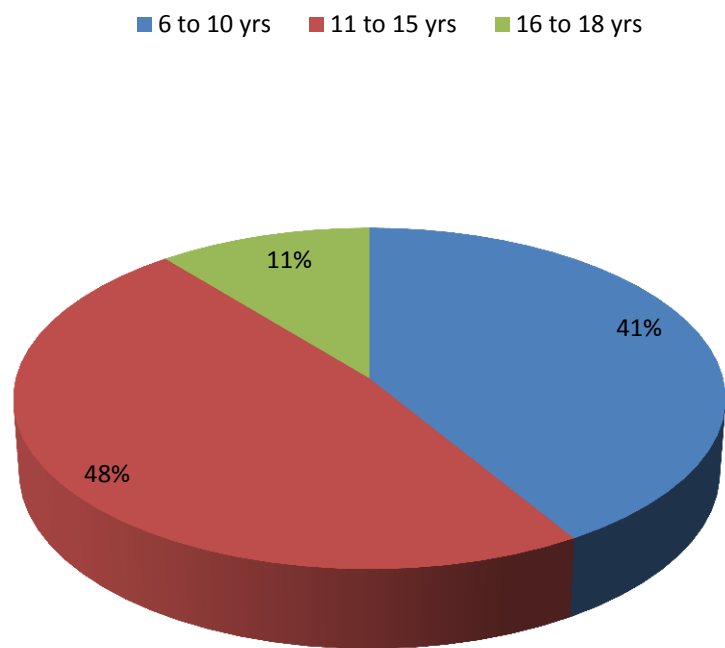
Chacha Nehru Bal Bhawan (CNBB) is a Child Care Institution for girls supported under Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India, New Delhi. It provides shelter and rehabilitation to children who are in need of care and protection. From the time of its inception till date, CNBB provided services to children from varying cases ranging from psycho-social support, educational support, institutional care, protection from all kinds of abuse and restoration to the family members. Analyzing the case data, it has been found that most of the cases brought to CNBB are children in need of shelter due to separation of parents, orphan case, missing case and sexual abuse case. The data manifests the prevailing issues faced by children within the district and suggests the kind of factors that one needs to be cautious when it comes to child issues.

Children of CNBB are separated into two groups for schooling. Children who are studying V grade and above are sent to Vungzagen Govt. High School, situated at the vicinity of the Home and children of IV grade and below studies at Bridging Gap Institute run by the organization. As school education alone does not suffice the educational needs of the children, three educators are provided in the children home in order to provide the holistic educational services needed by the children.

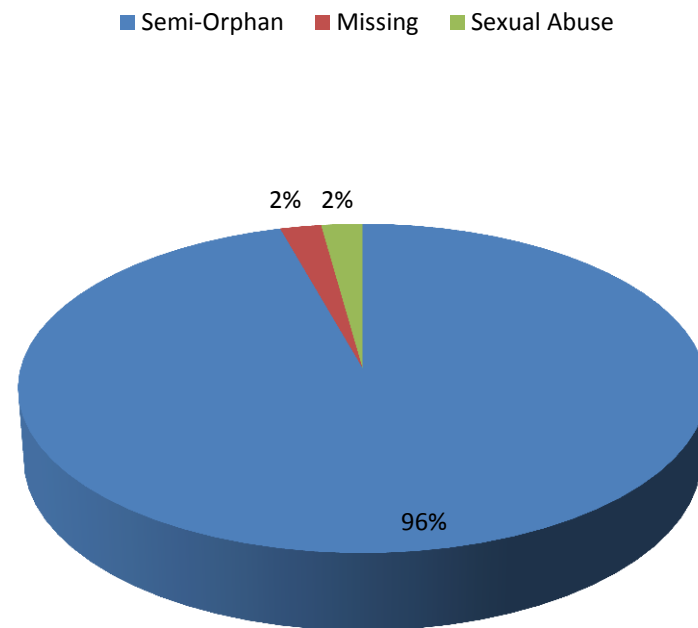

SPECIAL SCHOOL FOR CHILDREN WITH HEARING & SPEECH IMPAIRMENT

SHARE extended its focus area to disability and run a special school for children with hearing and speech impairment named Bridging Gap Institute under the support of Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India, New Delhi. SHARE - through its outreach activities - has encountered several cases where children with speech and hearing impaired are often segregated from the mainstream and their schooling has not been encouraged due to the stigma attached with the disability. SHARE tried to mitigate such stigma through its initiative by establishing a school where children with speech and hearing impairment would come out of their confined four walls and explore the world.

In the year 2019-2020, SHARE sent two survey teams to remote villages of Singhat, Sangaikot, Henglep subdivisions. for identification of persons with hearing and speech impairment. Through the survey report, it has been observed that high rate of children with disability are in need of services such as therapies and education.

Bridging Gap Institute also facilitated the children through outdoor exposures in the learning process. It has organized study tour, picnic and sports activities outside the school campus. The objective of outdoor exposures is not only for achieving its scheduled activities, but also encouraging children to socialize and also for the school to maintain inclusiveness in the society.

SENIOR CITIZENS' HOME FOR OLDER WOMEN

Themnu Aged Care Home is an aged home run under the scheme – Senior Citizens' Home for Older Women under the support of Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment (Ageing Division), Govt. of India. The Home has encountered many cases of older women neglected or ignored by the family members. This indicates the prevalent issues faced by older women in the district of Churachandpur. However, it is to be mentioned that a single factor does not generalize the whole issues faced by women.

Under the Aged Care Home, a holistic care plan has been used to focus on all aspects of an elderly woman. The care plan for each individual is reviewed with a focus on physical and mental health, social activities, cognitive ability, nutrition and personal needs. Maintaining this approach allows them to get the support and care they need while retaining their dignity.

For the concern of the development of each inmate, outdoor exposures and recreational activities are regularly conducted. In the year 2019-2020, the inmates practised Vaiphei folk dance and performed their best at the observance of International Day for Older persons at IRDEO, Thoubal on the 12th October, 2019. All the inmates have also participated in the fun games regularly organized at the Home campus. This has facilitated in the development of their physical, mental and emotional well-being. Such activities has also facilitated in the process of achieving a life with good health, dignity, independence and finally a peaceful death.

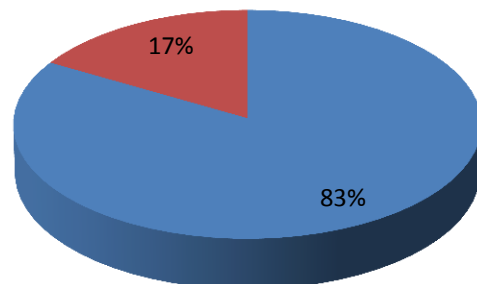
CHILDLINE SUB-CENTRE

Childline India is a project of Ministry of Women and Child Development. Childline India Foundation is a non-government organisation (NGO) in India that operates a telephone helpline called CHILDLINE 1098, for children in distress. SHARE made its partnership with Childline India as Childline Sub Centre since 2018.

With almost two years of its service as CHILDLINE Sub-Centre, SHARE has encountered multiple aspects of issues such as children in need of care, shelter, nutrition and lack of educational support. For such, SHARE has tried its best in providing the needs of children in vulnerable condition. SHARE also translated “KOMAL” (a video on child sexual abuse) into local dialect for the interests of the local community.

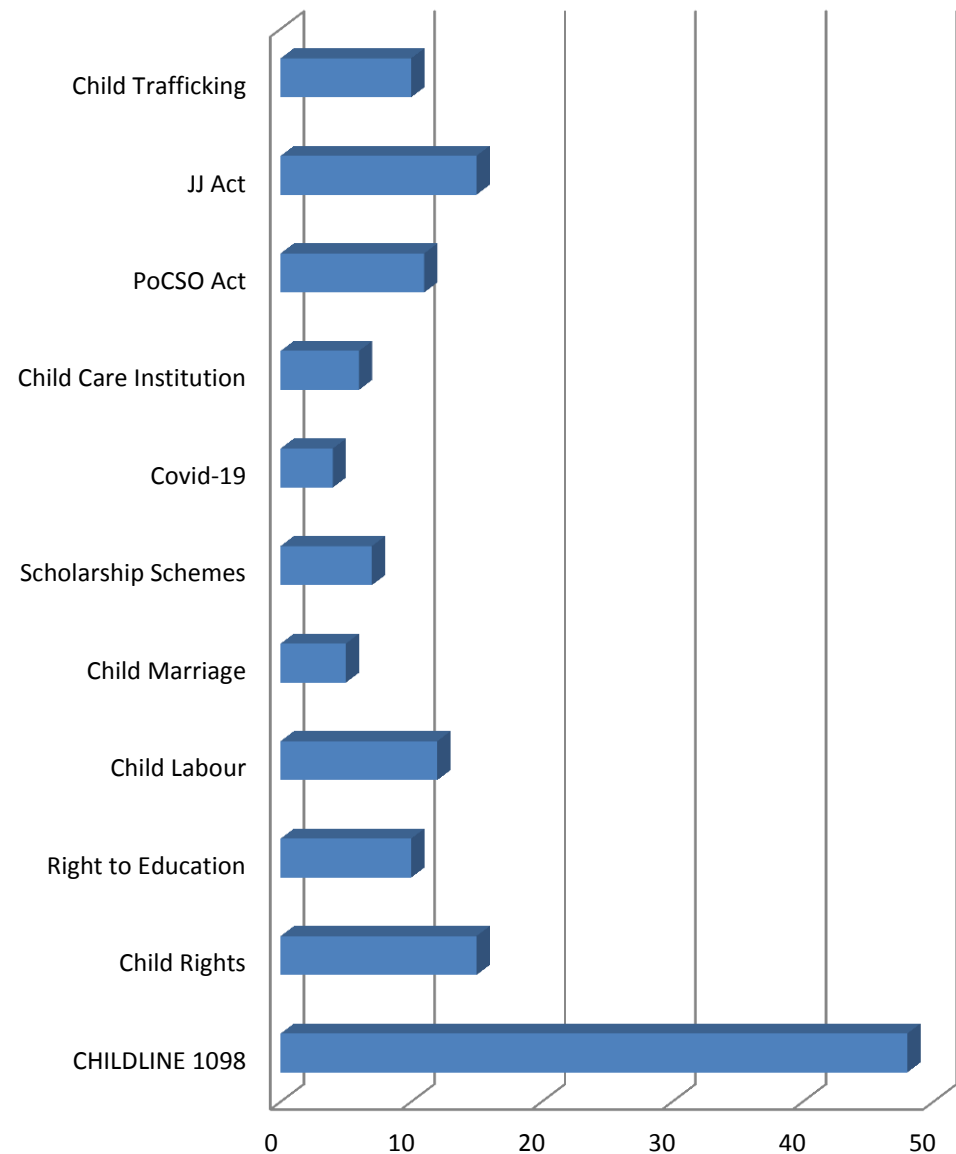
SHARE has been allotted four blocks – North Lamka, South Lamka, Thanlon, and Lanva. Within this allotted areas, SHARE has conducted activities such as Community Awareness, School Awareness, Open House and Outreach for dissemination of information and awareness on child issues. SHARE has also collaborated with the District Administration at the observance of International Girl Day and organized activities of Story-Telling based on the theme “Girls Force- Unscripted & Unstoppable”. The Story Telling competition engaged lots of students from various schools and it has facilitated in the process of awareness on girl child. For the same event, video has also been created by collecting the experiences of prominent women from different fields in the district and Ms. Amrita Sinha, IPS, Superintendent of Police, Churachandpur did the forwarding of the video and shared her experiences as a girl child.

DORKI TAILORING TRAINING CENTRE

Dorki Tailoring Training Centre has been set up and run since 2016 from its own sources. It envisaged to bring economic and skill empowerment to girls within the district of Churachandpur. The training course is for 3 months of each batch. Each year, SHARE has been able to conduct 3 courses with an approximate of 90-100 adolescent girls completed their training. The course has enabled the girls to be economically independent and enhance their self-esteem. They are now able to earn an income and in most cases, they have become the sole bread earner for the family through their tailoring business. Some of the girls are self-employed and envisioned to set up their own tailoring training centre in the near future, whereas others envisioned to enhance their tailoring skills by working under prominent designers in the district.

Despite getting lesser opportunities in terms of education as compared to their male siblings, girls under this tailoring training project grasp the opportunity of learning new skills. So far, this new skills have allowed them to contribute to the family and they now have a bigger say within the family. Also in some cases, the girls mentioned that their opinions are now put under consideration whereas in earlier times, they were not even allowed to voice their opinions on family matter. Thereby, acquiring skills for economic advancement has proved to be potential for empowering girls in all respects.

Through our research, it has been found that a huge number of adolescent girls engaged themselves in community affairs, church leadership, etc after acquiring skills and becoming a contributing agent to the family. This indicates that acquiring one skill has encouraged them to explore other skills which remained unexplored earlier. The trainings they have obtained has also enabled them to be confident, self-sufficient and independent individuals.

GRACE GIRLS' HOSTEL

Since the early of 1990s, a huge population of tribals started migrating from their native villages to the town area in a view for a safer place and a conducive environment for their children's education. However, the future has not always been in favour of everyone that led to a large number of children into labour and exploitation. Such implication has been severe in the case of a girl child as girls are subservience when poverty and education interplay. In the past decade, it has been reported and observed that a lot of young girls moved from their native village to the town for studying. However, with the insufficient income of the parents, surviving in the town has been challenging. Thereby, it compelled them to engage in certain kinds of exploitation such as sex workers, and fall in the trap of traffickers.

With the issues mapped during the outreach programmes, SHARE took the initiative in resolving such issues and tried to provide a solution by implementing a project on Hostel through the organization's own sources and various contributions. The hostel is named 'Grace Girls Hostel' located at Compound Veng, D Phailian, Churachandpur. The hostel has a number of 30 girls in the current year. It has also been observed that there are a large proportion of girls who are in need of shelter and a safer environment. SHARE envisions enlarging its project by accommodating higher proportion of girls under its project.

Grace Girls' Hostel project is not a mere shelter home for girls. It extends its capacity by facilitating in the personality development of the inmates; also, provide counseling to the inmates in need of such services by linking with other allied system. Activities such as volleyball tournament, badminton, and many others have been initiated within the community for the well-being of the inmates.

POULTRY AND PIGGERY FARMING PROGRAMME

Poultry and Piggery rearing programme has solely been an initiative of SHARE for a sustainable livelihood. Such livelihood programme has been implemented with a view that the organization sustains for atleast a short period of time despite the delay of funds from certain sources. This programme has enabled in improving the quality of life and constructively contributes to the communities.

Through this programmes, SHARE has been able to extend its helping hands to the communities by contributing a certain portion of its products during the lockdown due to COVID-19 in its neighbouring areas. It has also been able to improve the standard of living of its workers, staff and the community as whole.

With the aim to bring sustainability to the organization, livestock rearing on poultry and piggery has been observed as the ultimate target for the programmes as it requires less investment compared to rearing other livestock with a rapid return on investment. In many respects, pigs and poultry are ideal in this regard. They have fast growth rates and good feed-to-meat conversion ratios; are relatively easy to raise, and do not require much space; have prolific breeding potential. These factors not only lead to increased profitability but will surely assist in meeting the growing demand for meat in future. Both the activities are a continuous source of income. Its products have been supplied to the markets in Lamka, Tuibuong and other major meat marketing places.
